The Art of the Right Question

*How to phrase what you seek
to receive a precise reading*

A precise reading always begins with a precise question.

This is the secret few people know when consulting OMEGAME: the quality of the answer you receive depends, in large part, on how you phrase your request.

This guide is not a list of rigid rules. It is an invitation to phrase your question with intelligence, so that the reading you receive is as precise as the situation you are facing.

A few minutes of reading. A considerable difference in what you will receive.

Describe without naming

When you ask your question, certain words carry associations, images, judgments within them. A brand name, a person's name, the name of a well-known country — these words are never neutral. They evoke something. And what they evoke can, unintentionally, colour a reading.

The rule is simple: describe elements by their characteristics rather than by their names. You alone hold the key to what each description truly represents.

INSTEAD OF:

"Which car should I choose between a Porsche and a Maserati?"

PHRASE IT:

"Between a black 650-horsepower convertible and a navy-blue sport SUV, which is least likely to disappoint me in the long run, in terms of well-being and satisfaction?"

You alone know which brand hides behind each description. The reading focuses on what matters — undistorted by what a name might evoke.

This principle applies to everything: people, companies, places. Describe a recruiter by a neutral characteristic rather than by the name of their corporation; evoke a city by what it represents to you rather than by its reputation. You thus give the reading rich and faithful material, free of anything that might deflect it.

SECOND KEY

Set the right criterion

A question must say what it is truly seeking.

"What is best for me?" leaves everything open. Best for what? Your happiness? Your finances? Your peace of mind? Your family? The long term? Each of these criteria can lead to a different answer — for what enriches you is not always what fulfils you.

The more your question specifies the criterion that truly matters, the more surgical the reading can be.

INSTEAD OF:

"Which company should I accept the position with?"

PHRASE IT:

"Between these two opportunities, which will offer me the most personal fulfilment and financial stability in the long run?"

A single question — but one that carries its own criterion. The reading then knows exactly what it must illuminate.

Notice: a question can intelligently combine two. "The most personally AND financially fulfilling in the long run" remains a single question, yet it opens the reading onto two dimensions that sometimes do not point to the same answer. This is precisely where the value of a true reading lies: revealing the tension between what one gains and what one lives.

Phrasing your question, step by step

- O1** **Identify the real stake.**
What truly matters in this situation? Happiness, money, peace, family, the long term? Name that criterion for yourself.
- O2** **Describe without naming.**
Replace brands, names, and well-known places with their essential characteristics. Keep the key to yourself.
- O3** **Combine into a single question.**
One clear sentence, carrying its criterion and describing its elements. That is all OMEGAME needs.

The final nuance

None of this is a prohibition.

You may ask a simple, direct question — it will receive an answer. But a carefully phrased question will receive a precise answer. The difference is yours to make.
